***Below is a non-exhaustive overview of the currently valid legislation most relevant for JFCNP and its personnel. Some of the measures listed below may be waived in a more restricted way by the Region's Governors, also with respect to only part of the regional territory, in case of clusters, particularly serious COVID outbreak, or outbreak of COVID variants.***

***Personnel should be aware that the regional authorities and national ministries will adopt measures specific to various activities. JFCNP personnel must respect the protocols adopted and continue to follow recommended public hygiene and physical distancing measures at all times, as indicated on the JFCNP website.***

***Any questions about current Italian legislative requirements should be addressed to the LEGAD but personnel are encouraged to first attempt to resolve issues within their respective NSEs.***

***The state of emergency has been prolonged until 31 December 2021.***

## **1. International Travel:**

The Italian legislation has identified five different lists of countries (from A to E, see below paragraphs), and has determined different rules applicable to travelers who want to access the Italian territory coming from these countries. The rules relevant to the different lists are subject to changes based on epidemiological considerations and, therefore, should be closely monitored before traveling.

Furthermore, the legal analysis below is based on Italian legislation and applies to travels to/from Italy; each of the other countries may have its own legislation and restrictions on travels. It is strongly recommended to get information on legal requirements imposed to travelers by the destination country.

Finally, travelers should be aware of the restrictions to travel within the Italian territory, to which they may be subject once arrived or returned to Italy (please see par. 4 below).

### **International travel for JFCNP military and civilian personnel:**

Military and civilian personnel assigned to JFCNP may enjoy exemptions from the legal requirements imposed by applicable legislation if travel is for duty reasons and on duty status, and if the traveler does not show clear COVID-based symptoms; please check paragraph 2 for more detailed info on the travel requirements, and relevant exemptions. JFCNP personnel are anyway obliged to fill in the on-line Passenger Locator Form, available at the following link: <https://app.euplf.eu/#/>.

Military and civilian personnel assigned to JFCNP that are not travelling for duty reasons are still bound by the travel restrictions listed in the paragraphs below. In all

cases, dependents of military and civilian personnel assigned to JFCNP are bound by travel restrictions listed in the paragraphs below.

### **Green Certification COVID 19:**

The Italian Government, in agreement with the Governments of the EU countries and of other non-EU countries, has launched the Green Certification program.

The Italian Government will issue Green Certification to:

- individuals who have received the first vaccination shot (if two are required), validity of six months, starting from the fifteenth day after the first shot and until the second shot administration ;
- individuals who have completed one of the four vaccinations cycle, validity of **twelve months**;
- individuals who have recovered from COVID and completed the prescribed isolation, validity of 180 days;
- individuals that have undergone a swab test (either a molecular test or s.c. "rapid" test, **to include tests performed through saliva sample**), validity of 2 days.

Only those who hold a Green Certification or equivalent certification, as accepted by Italy, will be able to perform the activities, or have access to the locations listed below (provisions valid for white, yellow, orange and red areas, in all contexts where the activity is allowed based on the local epidemiological conditions):

- restaurants, pizzerias, etc. which operate indoor (take away service or outdoor service are exempted). **The Green Certification will not be required to access indoor restaurants located within hotels and reserved for hotel's customers**;
- shows open to the public and sport events (indoor and outdoor);
- museums, exhibits and other cultural sites (indoor and outdoor);
- swimming pools, gyms, team sports, wellness centers that operate indoor, to include those within hotels;
- festivals, fairs, conventions, congresses (indoor and outdoor);
- thermal centers **(with the exception of prescribed medical treatments)**, amusement parks;
- cultural centers, social and recreational centers that operate indoor;
- arcades, bingo and casinos (indoor and outdoor);
- public competitive exams;
- **parties that follow civil and religious ceremonies (indoor and outdoor)**;
- **access to all types of school facilities (students are not subject to this obligation)**;
- **access to universities and equal level school and courses (to include students)**;
- **accompany patients of hospitals, emergency rooms, centers for medical tests and for specialists' visits**;
- **access by visitors to hospices, old people's homes, etc.**;
- move between areas classified as "orange" or "red";

Additionally, the Green Certification or equivalent certification is required in order to be able to utilize the following means of public transportation: airplanes, ships and ferries for interregional transportation (ferries for the transportation on the Strait of Messina are excluded), High Speed trains, Intercity trains, busses for the interregional transportation, busses for rental (when driving services are also provided).

These restriction will not be applicable to children under the age of 12 and to individuals exonerated from vaccinations because of health reasons, duly provided with the valid medical certificate that can be issued in the cases identified by the Italian Ministry of Public Health.

Owners and holders of the above listed activities, and individuals they will delegate, are obliged and have the authority to check Green Certifications of those seeking access to such activities, and to check personal ID card if needed. Requirement for Green Certification in order to have access to a specific typology of activity can only be established by law.

Italian citizens who are entitled, for any of the reasons mentioned above, to the Green Certification will receive a link to the digital version of the Certificate in QR Code format; the Certification can be downloaded on mobile devices or printed. Citizens will also be able to request the digital Certificate via the website [www.dgc.gov.it](http://www.dgc.gov.it), or request the paper version to family doctors and pharmacies showing fiscal code and sanitary card (if the individual does not have a sanitary card, request shall be sent at [www.dgc.gov.it](http://www.dgc.gov.it)). Non-Italian citizens will receive the Green Certification COVID by their respective nations and according to national issuing mechanisms.

Green Certifications issued by EU and Schengen countries have been standardized and therefore have same legal validity throughout these countries. Holders of the Green Certificate will be authorized to waive totally or in part to the various requirements imposed on international travel; to travel within Italian regions even if declared “orange” or “red; to participate to public events; etc, as determined by the legislation that will be gradually passed. In general, the Certificate will allow the holders to perform all those activities for which the law will prescribe that the Certificate is required and for this reason, all those individuals who are tasked to exercise control on such activities (public officers; individuals who control entertainment activities, or stores open to the public; employees of public and private transportation firms; etc.) will have the duty and the right to review the Certificates.

The above described integrated system has been established and adopted by all EU and Schengen countries; similar certificates issued by third countries may be recognized the same legal validity based on *ad hoc* agreements. These certificates will need to be in either Italian, or French, or English, or Spanish language.

The Green Certification issued by a foreign country may be valid for use on the Italian territory, but may not be recognized as granting access to the Italian territory; in this case, traveler may be still required to abide by the requirement imposed to those who

do not have the certificate (swab test, self-isolation etc., depending on the different country).

## **2. Lists of Countries and Applicable Rules for Each List:**

**List A.** List A includes: Vatican City, San Marino - Travel to and from these countries is allowed for any reason. No Green Certificate COVID, no self-isolation or testing is required.

**List B.** List B includes the countries that the Ministry of Public Health should identify as having an extremely low epidemiological risk.

Travel to/from countries included in list B is allowed for any reason.

No country is currently included in list B.

**List C.** List C includes: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark (including Faer Oer Island and Greenland), Estonia, Finland, France (to include Guadalupa, Martinica, Guyana, Reunion, Mayotte, while other territories not located on the European continent are excluded), Germany, Greece, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, The Netherlands (with the exclusion of territories not located on the European continent), Poland, Portugal (including Azores and Madeira Islands), Czech Republic, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain (to include territories located on the African continent), Sweden, Hungary, Iceland, Norway, Liechtenstein, Switzerland, Andorra, Principality of Monaco, Israel.

Travel to and from these countries is allowed for any reason, but conditioned upon the following requirements. Travelers coming from, or who have traveled through countries C in the previous 14 days must:

- 1: provide the Passenger Locator Form (available at the following link: <https://app.eu-plf.eu/#/>), either downloaded on owned mobile device, or on paper copy, and
- 2: provide a Green Certification or equivalent certification (see above, pag. 2) proving one of the following circumstances:
  - to have completed the COVID 19 vaccination cycle (both shots, for those vaccinations for which a two-shots cycle is envisioned) at least 14 days before the travel, or;
  - to have recovered from COVID 19, or;
  - to have tested negative to a swab test done 48 hours prior to arrival in Italy.

If travelers enter the Italian territory in violation of the above requirements they will have to:

- remain in self-isolation for 5 days upon arrival in Italy at the address indicated in the Passenger Locator Form;
- additionally, undergo a swab test at the end of the 5 days isolation;

In addition to the above, please note that travelers landing at the Airport of Naples coming from countries C that do not have a Green Certification or equivalent certification will have to undergo a swab test within the airport, and will be required to take all necessary measures depending on the test results.

#### TRAVELS FROM ISRAEL:

Travelers coming from, or who have traveled through this country in the previous 14 days must:

- 1: provide the Passenger Locator Form (available at the following link: <https://app.eu-plf.eu/#/>), either downloaded on owned mobile device, or on paper copy, and
- 2: provide a Green Certification or equivalent certification (see above, pag. 2) proving one of the following circumstances:
  - to have completed the COVID 19 vaccination cycle (both shots, for those vaccinations for which a two-shots cycle is envisioned) approved by the EU health authorities at least 14 days before the travel, or;
  - to have recovered from COVID 19, or;
  - to have tested negative to a swab test done 48 hours prior to arrival in Italy.

**List D.** List D includes: Albania, Saudi Arabia, Armenia, Australia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia Herzegovina, Brunei, **Canada**, United Arab Emirates, Japan, Jordan, Lebanon, Kosovo, Moldova, Montenegro, New Zealand, Qatar, United Kingdom (to include Gibraltar, Isle of Man, Channel Islands, UK bases in Cyprus with the exclusion of the territories not in the European continent), Republic of Korea, Republic of North Macedonia, Serbia, Singapore, **Unites States**, Ukraine, Taiwan, and the special administrative regions of Hong Kong and Macao.-

Travel to and from these countries is allowed for any reason, but conditioned upon the following requirements. Travelers coming from, or who have traveled through countries D in the previous 14 days must do all of the following:

- 1: provide the Passenger Locator Form (available at the following link: <https://app.eu-plf.eu/#/>), either downloaded on owned mobile device, or on paper copy.
- 2: provide a Green Certification or equivalent certification (see above, pag. 2) proving to have completed the COVID 19 vaccination cycle (both shots, for those vaccinations for which a two-shots cycle is envisioned) approved by the EU health authorities at least 14 days before the travel
- 2: provide proof of having tested negative to a molecular or antigenic swab test performed in the 72 hours prior to arrival in Italy. This period is reduced to 48 hours for

travelers arriving from the United Kingdom (to include Gibraltar, Isle of Man, Channel Islands, UK bases in Cyprus with the exclusion of the territories not in the European continent).

If travelers enter the Italian territory in violation of the above requirements they will have to:

- remain in self-isolation for 5 days upon arrival in Italy at the address indicated in the Passenger Locator Form;
- additionally, undergo a swab test at the end of the 5 days isolation.

#### TRAVELS FROM CANADA, UNITED STATES, JAPAN

Travelers coming from, or who have traveled through these countries in the previous 14 days are not subject to the requirement to self-isolate and undergo the swab test normally valid for countries D (see above), provided that they:

- 1: provide the Passenger Locator Form (available at the following link: <https://app.eu-plf.eu/#/>), either downloaded on owned mobile device, or on paper copy.
- 2: provide a Green Certification or equivalent certification (see above, pag. 2) issued by the national authorities;
- 3: additionally, provide proof of having tested negative to a molecular or antigenic swab test performed in the 72 hours prior to arrival in Italy.

Travelers who do not have the Green Certification or equivalent certification can still enter the Italian territory, but in such case the general requirements set for countries D will apply.

In addition to the above, please note that travelers landing at the Airport of Naples coming from Canada and United States that do not have the Green Certification or equivalent certification will have to undergo a swab test within the airport, and will be required to take all necessary measures depending on the test results.

**List E.** This list includes all those countries not expressly indicated in any other list (travel to/from Brazil, India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka is subject to special, more restrictive provisions extended until 30 August).

Travel to and from these countries is generally not allowed.

Travel from Italy TO countries E is allowed only for work, health, study, return to own residency/domicile/abode, or absolute urgencies. Travels for tourism to countries E is prohibited.

Travel FROM countries E is allowed only for work, health, study, return to own residency/domicile/abode, or absolute urgencies. Also, Italian/EU/Schengen citizens and their families, and those who have a sojourn permit with their families will always be allowed to return to their domicile/residence in Italy. Travels for tourism from countries E is prohibited.

Even for authorized travels, upon their arrival in Italy individuals who travel from or have transited through countries E in the previous 14 days must anyway:

1: provide the Passenger Locator Form (available at the following link: <https://app.eu-plf.eu/#/>), either downloaded on owned mobile device, or on paper copy.

2: provide proof of having tested negative to a molecular or antigenic swab test performed in the 72 hours prior to arrival in Italy;

- additionally, upon their arrival in Italy they must self-isolate for a period of 10 days at the address indicated in the Passenger Locator Form;

- additionally, at the end of the 10 days isolation they must undergo a further swab test.

Flights to/from **Brazil** are suspended, and entry into Italian territory is generally prohibited to anybody coming from or who has transited through Brazil in the previous 14 days. Limited exceptions are foreseen (return to own domicile, etc.). Members of international organizations and military personnel, both travelling on duty status, can request a special authorization to the Italian Ministry of Public Health to enter the Italian territory following special mandatory requirements (swab test, self-isolation, etc.).

Flights to/from **India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka** are suspended, and entry into Italian territory is generally prohibited to anybody coming from or who has transited through Brazil in the previous 14 days. Limited exceptions are foreseen (return to own domicile, etc.). Members of international organizations and military personnel, both travelling on duty status, can request a special authorization to the Italian Ministry of Public Health to enter the Italian territory following special mandatory requirements (swab test, etc.).

## **2.1 General exceptions to the requirement for green certification COVID, swab test, self-isolation, and further swab-test in connection to international travel (synthesis of interest of JFCNP personnel)**

2.1. A - Partial exemptions.

Upon condition that the traveler shows no COVID-related symptoms, the following individuals are **not** required to self-isolate nor to undergo the follow-up health surveillance and swab test after the arrival in Italy:

- officers of the EU and of other international organizations, diplomatic agents and other technical personnel from diplomatic missions, consular officers, military personnel to include those returning from international missions, police and secret services personnel, firefighters – all the above if travel is on duty status;

- citizens or residents of countries belonging to the EU and to countries in lists A, B, C, and D who enter the Italian territory for work reasons (unless in the previous 14 days they have transited through or stayed in a country C);
- students who travel to attend class lessons in a country different from the county of residence/domicile/abode, only in those cases where the student needs to return to the country of residence/domicile/abode every day or once a week.

Travelers in the categories above are still obliged to:

- provide the Passenger Locator Form;
- provide a Green Certificate or an equivalent certificate;
- undergo a swab test 48 or 72 hours (as applicable) prior to arrival in Italy, where envisioned.

### 2.1. B - Complete exemption:

Upon condition that the traveler shows no COVID-related symptoms, the following individuals are **not** required to undergo a swab test within 48 or 72 hours (as applicable) prior to arrival in Italy where envisioned, nor to provide a Green Certificate or equivalent certificate, nor to self-isolate and undergo the follow-up health surveillance and swab test after arrival in Italy:

- individuals who travel through the Italian territory by private means for a maximum of 36 hours, upon condition that at the expiration of the 36 hours the traveler either immediately leaves Italy or self-isolates for 5 days and undergoes a follow-up swab test;
- individuals who travel in the Italian territory for work reasons, health reasons or other absolute urgencies for no longer than 120 hours, upon condition that if travel extends beyond 120 hours, the individual must either immediately leave the country or initiate self-isolation and health surveillance;
- travels from countries A;

Travelers in the categories above are still obliged to- provide the Passenger Locator Form.

### **3. General Rules for Travelers:**

Children below the age of 6 are exempted from the swab test requirement.

Where the measure of self-isolation is prescribed, it will apply to travelers entering the Italian territory by any means, to include via private vehicle.

Travelers are obliged to inform the local health authorities in case of development of any COVID-19 related symptoms.



Travelers who enter or sojourn or travel through other regions may be subject to requirements dictated by specific ordinances of the region's Governor of which they should be aware through consultation on the region's website.

It is highly recommended to check whether any additional or different requirements are imposed by the country of destination, and/or by the transportation company utilized.

#### **4. Measures and restrictions applicable within Italian territory, to include travel:**

The national Government has identified sanitary protocols, measures and restrictions that will apply to the entire national territory regardless of any provision specifically applicable to an identified area within the national territory.

The Government has then identified different measures and restrictions applicable to the different regions or areas of the Italian territory, depending on their respective epidemiological situation and relevant level of risk. An area may be therefore declared red, orange, yellow or white in decreasing order of seriousness (red=highest level of contagion/risk; white=lowest level of contagion/risk). The decision will be made via a decree to be issued by the Ministry of Public Health in agreement with each region's Governor; such decrees will have a validity of 15 days but may be amended or updated as required. Areas identified as yellow, orange and red will be required to implement additional, increasingly high restrictions in addition to those envisioned for the national territory.

The Regional Governors have also the authority to declare the region "red" and/or to identify further, more stringent measures or restrictions to be applied to the regional territory, or to parts of it. These measures will add up to those already in place due to the national legislation.

Please refer to the paragraph on the Green Pass above regarding the obligation to show a Green Pass in order to be allowed access to and performance of the activities listed therein.

##### **4.1. Measures applicable to the entire national territory:**

It is mandatory to always maintain the interpersonal distance of at least 1 meter, or more where prescribed.

Individuals who suffer from physical or psychiatric disabilities may reduce the interpersonal distance from their supporting individuals.

Use of masks is mandatory at any time both in indoor and outdoor areas, unless otherwise provided by specific approved sanitary protocols. Masks are not mandatory in all those places where it is possible, due to their characteristics, to ensure isolation from other individuals in a continuative manner. Use of masks is not mandatory at home and in private homes, but it is strongly recommended at the presence of individuals who are not usual cohabitants.

Children below six years and individuals otherwise not fully self-sufficient are exempted from the requirement but must be carefully monitored.

Use of masks is not required while performing sport activities, but interpersonal distance must be observed.

Masks must be carried at any time so be ready to wear them as required. Individuals are allowed to use either surgical masks or other masks also self-produced, as long as they cover nose and mouth and are made from proper materials (comfortable for breathing but able to work as a barrier).

Use of masks alone is not sufficient and must be accompanied by the prescribed additional sanitary measures, namely interpersonal distance and constant and accurate hand hygiene.

Individuals who have respiratory infection with temperature of 37, 5 degrees or above must stay home and contact the family doctor.

Productive, commercial and industrial activities will apply the respective, agreed protocols on the sanitary measures to be implemented in the workplace.

Governmental and Public Administration entities must adopt teleworking to the maximum extent possible, even if this implies a change in tasks and duties. These entities must organize working activities in a way to differentiate entry and exit times.

Private employers are strongly recommended to allow teleworking to the maximum extent possible, and to organize working activities in a way to differentiate entry and exit times.

Please refer to the paragraph on the Green Pass above regarding the obligation to show a Green Pass in order to be allowed access to and performance of the activities listed therein.

#### **4.2. Measure applicable to WHITE areas:**

The general restrictions and measures valid for the national territory described at par. 4.1 above apply; the sanitary protocols specifically approved for each activity apply and must be followed. Please refer to the paragraph on the Green Pass above regarding the obligation to show a Green Pass in order to be allowed access to and performance of the activities listed therein, all valid in white areas.

Use of the mask in indoor places is mandatory (use at home or in indoor places when the only other present are usual cohabitants, is not required). Use of masks outdoor is generally not mandatory, unless it is not possible to observe the mandatory interpersonal distance of at least one meter. It is therefore mandatory to carry a mask at all times, and to wear it when in indoor spaces, in outdoor spaces where the interpersonal distance cannot be observed, or in presence of individual(s) whose health conditions

are known to be particularly fragile or compromised for any reason. Use of masks indoor or outdoor is not required while eating (when allowed) and while performing sport activities (when allowed).

It is not allowed to accompany patients when they are in the waiting room of hospitals and emergency rooms, of centers for medical tests and for specialists' visits, or are otherwise hospitalized.

Museums and other cultural sites can open with the modalities prescribed by the applicable sanitary protocols and regulating access of visitors in a way to prevent gatherings. Visits on weekends to museums and other cultural sites that are usually particularly crowded (i.e. above one million visitors per year) can take place only if previously booked on-line, at least one day in advance.

Shows open to the public (in theatres, music halls, movie theatres, etc.) can take place only with pre-assigned posts respecting the interpersonal distance (cohabitants excluded) in accordance with the imposed capacity limits. If the implementation of these measures is not possible the show cannot take place.

Discos and dancing rooms remain closed.

Please check provisions applicable in the territory of Campania region (par. 5).

As of 20 September, Abruzzo, Basilicata, Calabria, **Campania**, Emilia Romagna, Friuli Venezia Giulia, Lazio, Liguria, Lombardia, Marche, Molise, Piemonte, Provincia Autonoma di Bolzano, Provincia Autonoma di Trento, Puglia, Sardegna, Toscana, Umbria, Veneto and Valle d'Aosta are white areas.

#### **4.3. Measures applicable to YELLOW areas:**

The general restrictions and measures valid for the national territory described at par. 4.1 above apply, as well as the sanitary protocols approved for each activity. Please also refer to the paragraph on the Green Pass above regarding the obligation to show a Green Pass in order to be allowed access to and performance of the activities listed therein, valid in yellow areas.

In addition, the following will apply.

Movements within a yellow area, and from a yellow area to a white area, are unrestricted at any time of the day.

Within the same region visits to another private home different from one's own are allowed with the following limitations: one visit per day, for a maximum of four individuals to be added to the individuals living there, which may be accompanied by children under 14 years of age, within the time limits valid (05.00/24.00).

Public manifestations, activities and events can only be held if organized in a static manner, assigning individuals to designated fixed positions, keeping the prescribed distance and following any other prescriptions provided by the authorizing entity.

The local competent authorities are allowed to prevent general access to specific squares/streets/areas in the city centers (with the exclusion of residents and work activities located therein), to the aim of preventing gatherings.

All commercial activities will have to show a sign indicating the maximum number of individuals that can be admitted at the same time on the basis of the applicable sanitary protocols.

Access to public parks and gardens, and to playgrounds and children's recreational areas is allowed in accordance with approved sanitary rules and protocols and without any gatherings.

It is recommended to avoid receiving at home individuals who are not usual cohabitants, and to limit such occasions to cases where this is necessary.

It is not allowed to accompany patients when they are in the waiting room of hospitals and emergency rooms, of centers for medical tests and for specialists' visits, or are otherwise hospitalized. Visits to retirement homes are allowed in accordance with specific requirements and sanitary protocols issued by the Ministry of Public Health.

Access to places of worship is admitted with the established modalities to prevent gatherings. Religious functions with people in attendance may be held if they are in compliance with the virus-containment protocols jointly agreed upon by the Government and the representatives of the various denominations.

Congresses and conferences can be held in presence.

Public ceremonies are held in accordance of prescribed sanitary measures and with no participation of public.

Work meetings, public and private job trainings may be held in presence, respecting the guidelines and protocols provided by the Italian Government.

Museums and other cultural sites can open with the modalities prescribed by the applicable sanitary protocols and regulating access of visitors in a way to prevent gatherings. Visits on weekends to museums and other cultural sites that are usually particularly crowded (i.e. above one million visitors per year) can take place only if previously booked on-line, at least one day in advance.

Exhibits can be held under same conditions as above.

Shows, plays, concerts indoor and outdoor can be held, with pre-assigned posts up to 50% max. of the overall capacity (up to max 1000 pax outdoor and 500 pax indoor), and respecting at least 1 meter of interpersonal distance.

The above-mentioned limits to number of spectators can be waived for outdoor events by the competent authorities.

Audience will be allowed to attend to all sport events held outdoor, with pre-assigned posts respecting the one-meter interpersonal distance up to 25% of the overall capacity (max 1000 pax).

Audience will be allowed to attend to all sport events held indoor, with pre-assigned posts respecting the one-meter interpersonal distance up to 25% of the overall capacity (max 500 pax).

Activities, both indoor and outdoor, in discos, lidos, hotels, or other spaces open to the public and generically dedicated to recreational activities, are prohibited.

Parties organized on the occasion of civil and religious services are authorized; participation must be restricted to individuals who have been issued a Green Certificate. Parties must be held in accordance with specific applicable sanitary protocols.

All celebrations and festivals, are prohibited.

Fairs can be held.

Individuals may engage in all kinds of physical and sport exercise outdoor, to include sports that imply physical contact and team sports.

When performing sport activities incompatible with wearing a mask, the mask must be carried on the person, and worn when in proximity of other individuals.

Gyms, swimming pools, fitness centers, thermal centers, wellness centers must remain closed, unless in cases where they provide medical services granted by the national health care system.

Swimming pools located outdoor can resume their activities.

Gyms can resume their activities, allowing an interpersonal distance of at least two meters, provided that they are provided with an adequate system for air ventilation, that use of changing room is not authorized, and that applicable sanitary protocols are implemented.

Starting from 01 July, swimming pools located indoor can resume their activities.

Starting from 01 July thermal centers can resume their activities.

Starting from 01 July, wellness centers can resume their activities.

Starting from 01 July, cultural, recreational and social centers can resume their activities. Sport centers who perform their activities outdoor may continue to operate following general rules on interpersonal distance and the applicable sanitary protocols; changing rooms cannot be utilized though and must remain closed.

Ski resorts may resume their activities.

Starting from 01 July, arcades, game rooms, bingo rooms, casinos can resume their activities.

Amusement parks can resume their activities.

Until the closure of the school year, nurseries, kindergartens, elementary schools and middle schools can perform their normal activities. High schools can perform their normal activities ensuring that a percentage between 70% and 100% of the students can attend courses at school, while the remainder will remain at home and adopts remote learning tools. The schools are authorized to employ the required level of flexibility in order to organize activities as above (flexible entry/exit times, etc.).

Universities will perform their activities (to include examinations and graduation sessions) mainly in presence, in accordance with *ad hoc* plans for the organization of curricular activities.

All students above age of 6 will wear a mask, with the exception of those who suffer from specific pathologies.

Regional Governors have the authorities to suspend school activities in attendance and order to adopt remote learning modality, in cases where epidemiological data so impose.

Schools institutions will provide for the regular, in depth sanitization of the classrooms/school buildings.

School trips or guided visits are suspended.

Commercial activities of any kind can take place only if conducted in accordance with the approved health protocols; access to the store areas must be regulated to avoid gatherings, masks must be worn and interpersonal distance maintained at any time. Shopping centers can perform their normal operations during weekends.

Restaurants, pubs, pastry shops, pizzerias etc. are allowed to operate with service at the table also indoor, within the time limits valid – if any.

At least one individual per table/group will be identified through ID card, for possible future contact tracing. Tables must be organized in such a way to allow a maximum of 4 pax (more pax allowed in case customers are cohabitant).

There are no time limits for restaurants within hotels (open only for hotel's guests).

Delivery service is allowed at any time, if conducted in accordance with approved sanitary rules and protocols. Take away service is allowed within the time limits valid – if any, Eating/drinking outside or in the proximity of the store is prohibited.

Contracted canteen and cafeteria services can take place, in accordance with applicable sanitary measures.

Canteens and bars/restaurants along the highways, in airports, ports, hospitals have no restrictions but must operate in accordance with applicable protocols.

Hotels can operate in accordance with approved sanitary protocols.

Hairdressers, estheticians can perform their activities, in accordance with applicable approved protocols.

Banks, insurance and financial companies can operate.

Employers are strongly recommended to allow smart work to the maximum extent possible. They are urged to adopt all protocols and practices required to ensure health and safety of personnel, as well as sanitization of the workplaces.

Means of public transportation can function only within the ceiling of up to the 50% of their normal capacity.

As of 20 September, Sicilia is a yellow area.

#### **4.4. Additional measures to be applied to ORANGE areas:**

All measures applicable to the general national territory (par. 4.1) and those applicable to the yellow areas (par. 4.3) still apply to Orange areas. Please also refer to the paragraph on the Green Pass above regarding the obligation to show a Green Pass in order to be allowed access to and performance of the activities listed therein, valid in orange areas.

In addition, the following also applies.

Movements in and out of the orange areas are prohibited if not for the following reasons: work, health, urgent necessities, when required to allow school activities, to return to own domicile/residence/abode, to reach other areas in Italy not affected by travel restrictions. Movements in and out of the orange areas will be also permitted to individuals who have a Green Certification COVID 19.

Within the orange area, movements to reach municipalities different than the one of own domicile/residence/abode, both with private or public means, are prohibited if not for reason of work, health, urgent necessities, or to benefit from services which are not suspended and not available within the municipality.

Visits to another private home different from one's own are allowed with the following limitations: one visit per day, for a maximum of four individuals to be added to the individuals living there, which may be accompanied by children under 14 years of age, within 05.00/22.00 hrs.

Travel from small municipalities (up to 5.000 inhabitants) to surrounding municipalities within 30 Km. is anyway allowed, with the exclusion of the province county seats (in Campania: Napoli, Avellino, Benevento, Caserta, Salerno).

Until the closure of the school year, nurseries, kindergartens, elementary schools and middle schools can perform their normal activities. High schools can perform their normal activities ensuring that a percentage between 70% and 100% of the students can attend courses at school, while the remainder will remain at home and adopts remote learning

tools. The schools are authorized to employ the required level of flexibility in order to organize activities as above (flexible entry/exit times, etc.).

Until 31 July, universities will perform their activities (to include examinations and graduation sessions) mainly in presence, in accordance with *ad hoc* plans for the organization of curricular activities.

Museums and other cultural sites must remain closed and exhibits must be suspended.

Shows, plays, concerts indoor and outdoor are suspended.

Restaurants, pubs, pastry shops etc. must remain closed, with the exception of restaurants within hotels, which can continue their operations for the exclusive benefit of those who are staying at the hotel itself. Contracted cafeteria and canteen services can operate under applicable sanitary protocols. Delivery is allowed, and take-away is authorized until 22.00 hrs. with the exclusion of bars which do not serve cooked food (take away allowed only until 18.00). Consumption of food and beverages in the vicinity of the store is prohibited.

Canteens and bars/restaurants along the highways, in airports, ports, hospitals have no time restrictions.

As of 20 September, there are no orange areas.

#### **4.5. Additional measures to be applied to RED areas:**

All measures applicable to the general national territory (par. 4.1) and those applicable to the yellow areas (par. 4.3) still apply to Red areas. Please also refer to the paragraph on the Green Pass above regarding the obligation to show a Green Pass in order to be allowed access to and performance of the activities listed therein, valid in red areas.

In addition, the following applies.

Movements in and out of the Red area as well as those within the area are prohibited, if not for the following reasons: work, health, urgent necessities, movements required to allow school activities, to return to own domicile/residence/abode, to reach other areas in Italy not affected by travel restrictions. Movements in and out of the red areas will be also permitted to individuals who have a Green Certification COVID 19.

Visits to another private home different from one's own are not allowed.

Travel from small municipalities (up to 5.000 inhabitants) to surrounding municipalities within 30 Km. is anyway allowed, with the exclusion of the province county seats (in Campania: Napoli, Avellino, Benevento, Caserta, Salerno).



Until the closure of the school year, nurseries, kindergartens, elementary schools and middle schools can perform their normal activities. High schools can perform their normal activities ensuring that a percentage between 50% and 75% of the students can attend courses at school, while the remainder will remain at home and adopts remote learning tools. The schools are authorized to employ the required level of flexibility in order to organize activities as above (flexible entry/exit times, etc.).

Activities for the first year of the university courses, examinations and graduation sessions will be performed in presence.

All sport activities are suspended, if not performed individually and outdoor. Physical activity is allowed in the vicinity of own abode and wearing a mask.

Museums and other cultural sites must remain closed and exhibits must be suspended.

Shows, plays, concerts indoor and outdoor are suspended.

Commercial activities are closed, with the exception of food stores, newsstands, tobacco stores, pharmacies, parapharmacies, and other essential activities listed in the DPCM such as gas stations, detergent stores, gardening stores, laundry shops, hardware stores, opticians, flower shops, book shops, stationary stores, computer stores, baby clothes and shoe stores, sports stores, car accessories stores, pet stores, toy stores, perfume shops, funeral homes, vending machines. Shopping centers are closed; the above listed activities located in shopping centers can operate with the exclusion of weekends, holidays and their preceding days, when they must remain closed. Only markets selling food and nursery gardens product can function.

Restaurants, pubs, pastry shops etc. must remain closed. Delivery is allowed, and take-away is authorized until 22.00 hrs. with the exclusion of bars and shops who are limited to the selling of alcohol (take away allowed only until 18.00); consumption of food and beverages in the vicinity of the restaurant is prohibited. Restaurants within hotels can continue their operations for the exclusive benefit of those who are staying at the hotel itself.

Contracted cafeteria and canteen services can operate under applicable sanitary protocols. Canteens and bars/restaurants along the highways, in airports, ports, hospitals have no time restrictions.

All personal care services are suspended with the exception of laundry shops and funeral homes.

As of 20 September, there are no red areas.

## **5. Measures issued by Campania region Government:**

Below are the additional measures that have been issued by the Campania region government and are applicable until 31 August in addition and/or in substitution of the measures currently applicable to the white areas and described above.

From 22.00 hrs. to 0600 hrs. of the following day:

- the takeaway sale of alcoholic beverages of any strength by any type of commercial activity to include bars, pizzerias, restaurants, pubs, kiosks, supermarkets, vending machines etc. is prohibited;
- consumption of alcoholic beverages of any strength in outdoor areas open to the public, to include areas in front of commercial activities, squares, public parks and gardens, etc. is prohibited;
- bars, wineries, kiosks, pastry shops and all restaurant commercial activities are authorized to sell alcoholic beverages only for consumption at the counter or at the table;
- gatherings for the consumption of any food and beverages in outdoor places open to the public are prohibited.

Based on the decree issued by the Ministry of the Public Health whereby use of masks in outdoor areas is still mandatory where it is impossible to maintain the interpersonal distance of at least one meter or where gatherings appear to be highly likely, individuals are obliged to wear masks in every non-isolated place, such as, for example, in urban centers, squares, and seafronts in times and situations of particular crowding; in queues, markets, fairs and other similar contexts; in public transportations means although in open air (such as ferries, boats, ships, etc.).

Travelers landing at the Airport of Naples coming from countries in list C as well as from Canada, Japan and United States, that do not have a Green Pass will have to undergo a swab test within the airport, and will be required to take all necessary measures depending on the test results. All travelers landing at the airport of Naples coming from other countries for which the national legislation does not envision an obligation to self-isolate upon arrival may be required to undergo swab tests within the airport.

## **6. Quarantine:**

Individuals in quarantine because of testing positive for COVID-19 must stay home or at the hospital until notified otherwise by health authorities. Individuals may be contacted by health officials and instructed to self-isolate if they have been in close contact with confirmed cases of COVID-19 or if such officials deem self-isolation to otherwise be necessary.

## **7. Sanctions:**

Violations of the above requirements may be punished with fines (from 400 to 3.000 euros) and criminal sanctions may be considered in the most serious cases.

**8. Duty to Notify:** If any JFCNP staff member or their family members begin to develop symptoms, or in cases where they have been in contact with positive or suspected positive COVID cases, they must immediately notify their family doctor by phone, the JFCNP Occupational Medicine Specialist via email (Nicola.olivieri@jfcnp.nato.int), their JFCNP chain of command, and their SNR.
